THIS CAUSE came on to be heard upon Petitioner, Frederick Alexander Rogers, III's voluntary tender to this Court of his license to practice law in the State of North Carolina because of incapacity. The Petitioner represented through Arridavit filed with this Court that he has an alcohol dependency problem which he fears will affect his capacity to practice law and that he considers this a disability which supports his transfer from active to intactive status. The Petitioner further consented to the Court's entering this Order accepting Petitioner's voluntary surrender of his license, finding of disability, and transfer of the Petitioner to the inactive and disabled list of attorneys until such time as Petitioner presents to the Court evidence which satisfies the Court that he has regained his capacity to practice law.

The Court having reviewed the Affidavi't of Petitioner and such evidence as this Court deems necessary to support this Order, the Court finds that there is a factual basis for this determination that the Petitioner is now disabled and for the entry of this Order finding Petitioner to be disabled and that there is further a factual basis for the exercise of this Court's inherent power to transfer Petitioner to an inactive status because of his disability.

IT IS THEREFORE, ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that Frederick Alexander Rogers, III be and hereby is transferred to inactive status as a member of the North Carolina Bar, and that this transfer is effective immediately. Upon the entry of this Order the Court acknowledges that Petitioner has surrendered to the Court his license to practice law. Upon overcoming his disability and

regaining capacity, Petitioner may petition a Resident Superior Court Judge of the Fifth Judicial District for transfer to active status and upon proof satisfactory to a Resident Superior Court Judge of the Fifth Judicial District that Petitioner has regained his capacity to practice law, the said judge may enter an Order transferring Petitioner back to active status.

Pursuant to Rule 22 of the Rules of The North Carolina State Bar, Ray Blackburn, Ralph Pennington, Jeffrey Baker and Robert U. Johnsen, all attorneys licensed to practice law in the State of North Carolina and who practice in New Hanover County in the Fifth Judicial District, are appointed to inventory the files of Petitioner in order to determine the status of each case, notify clients of Petitioner's disability and the need to take possession of their files, and to take such other action as may be appropriate in order to protect the interest of Petitioner and his clients.

A copy of this Order shall be served upon Petitioner and upon the Secretary of The North Carolina State Bar.
