This matter is before the Secretary of the North Carolina State Bar pursuant to a petition for reinstatement filed on July 30, 1993, by Benjamin S. Marks, Jr.

It appears from a review of the Order of Discipline entered on March 15, 1993, that petitioner was ordered suspended from the practice of law for three years stayed for thirty months so long as he complied with Sections 24 and 25(B) of the Rules and Regulations of the North Carolina State Bar and violated no laws of the State of North Carolina and no provisions of the Rules of Professional Conduct during the three year stay.

It further appears that petitioner:


1. Has complied with Article IX, Sections 24 and 25(B) of the Rules and Regulations of the North Carolina State Bar;
2. Has not violated any laws of the State of North Carolina nor any Rules of Professional Conduct; and
3. Has abstained from the unauthorized practice of law during the period of suspension.

After conducting the necessary investigation regarding petitioner's compliance with the requirements set forth above, counsel for the North Carolina State Bar filed no objection to the petition within the time required by Article IX, Section 25.

Therefore, pursuant to Article IX, Section 25(B)(5) of the Rules and Regulations of the North Carolina State Bar, it is hereby ordered as follows:

1. Benjamin S. Marks, Jr. is reinstated to the active practice of law in North Carolina as of the date of this order; and
2. The North Carolina State Bar membership card and North Carolina license of Benjamin S. Marks, Jr. shall be returned to him.
