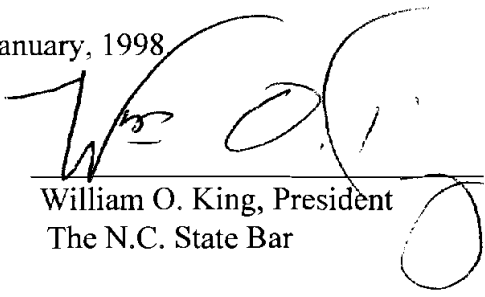
THIS MATTER coming on to be heard and being heard by the Council of the North Carolina State Bar pursuant to 27 N.C. Admin. Code Chapter 1, Subchapter B, § .0117(a) of the State Bar Discipline & Disability Rules upon an affidavit of tender of surrender of license executed by Ronald Kent Campbell on Dec. 31, 1997 and filed in the offices of the North Carolina State Bar on Dec. 31, 1997.

Based upon the affidavit, the Council finds that Ronald Kent Campbell's conduct of misappropriating client funds is grounds for discipline pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 84-28(b)(2) in that Ronald Kent Campbell violated Rules 1.2(b)(and (c) of the Rules of Professional Conduct.

WHEREFORE, upon Motion made and duly seconded, the Council enters the following Order:

1. The tender of surrender of license of Ronald Kent Campbell is hereby accepted.
2. Ronald Kent Campbell is hereby is DISBARRED from the practice of law in North Carolina.
3. Ronald Kent Campbell shall comply with the provisions of 27 N.C.A.C. Chapter 1, Subchapter B, § .0124 of the State Bar Discipline & Disbarment Rules and shall surrender his license and permanent membership card to the Secretary of the North Carolina State Bar along with the affidavit required by § .0124 of the State Bar Discipline & Disbarment Rules.
4. The costs of this action are taxed against Ronald Kent Campbell.

To: The Council of the North Carolina State Bar

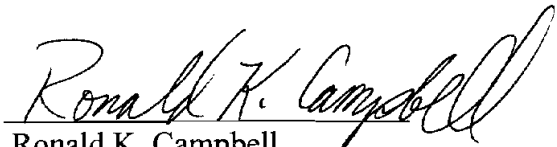

I am aware that there are presently pending investigations or other proceedings regarding allegations that I have been guilty of misconduct, to wit:

Misappropriating \$5,600 in funds from the Brian Alston trust.

I acknowledge that the material facts upon which the complaints are predicated are true. I am submitting my resignation because I know that if charges were predicated upon the misconduct currently under investigation I could not successfully defend against them.
