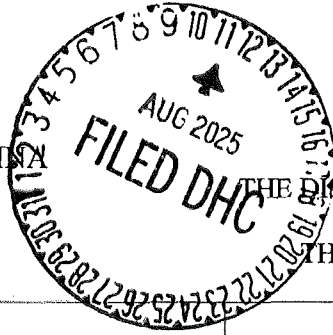

ORDER SUSPENDING  
RESPONDENT'S LAW LICENSE  
FOR NONCOMPLIANCE

This matter was considered by the Chair of the Disciplinary Hearing Commission pursuant to the North Carolina State Bar Discipline and Disability Rules, 27 N.C. Admin. Code 1B.0135. Petitioner, the North Carolina State Bar, was represented by G. Patrick Murphy. Respondent, Andre N. Hogan, was not represented, did not make an appearance in this matter, and did not file a response to the Order to Show Cause for Grievance Noncompliance served upon him.

Based on the filings, the Chair of the Disciplinary Hearing Commission finds by clear, cogent, and convincing evidence the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Petitioner, the North Carolina State Bar ("State Bar"), is a state agency duly organized under the laws of North Carolina and is the proper party to bring this proceeding under the authority granted it in Chapter 84 of the General Statutes of North Carolina and the Rules and Regulations of the North Carolina State Bar (Chapter 1 of Title 27 of the North Carolina Administrative Code).
2. Respondent, Andre N. Hogan, was licensed to practice law in North Carolina in 2005 and is, and was at all times referred to herein, an attorney at law licensed to practice in North Carolina, subject to the laws of the State of North Carolina, the Rules and Regulations of the North Carolina State Bar, and the Rules of Professional Conduct.
3. The State Bar's membership database shows the following address and email on record for Respondent: P.O Box 10033, Wilmington, NC 28404 and *andrehoganlaw@ymail.com*.
4. On May 14, 2025, Petitioner sent Hogan a Letter of Notice in 24G0560, 25G0329, 25G0407, and 25G0408 to *andrehoganlaw@ymail.com*.
5. On May 14, 2025, Hogan replied stating he would accept service via email.
6. Despite agreeing to accept service, Hogan did not complete and return the Acceptance of Service to the State Bar.

7. On June 6, 2025, Petitioner attempted to serve the Letter of Notice in grievance file numbers 24G0560, 25G0329, 25G0407, and 25G0408 on Hogan via certified mail to P.O Box 10033, Wilmington, NC 28404.

8. The certified mail was unclaimed by Hogan.

9. On July 1, 2025, Petitioner personally served Hogan with the Letters of Notice in grievance files 24G0560, 25G0329, 25G0407, 25G0408, and 25G0597.

10. On July 1, 2025, Respondent accepted service of the Letter of Notice.

11. Respondent's response to the Letter of Notice was due within 15 days of receipt of the Letter of Notice, which was July 16, 2025.

12. Respondent did not respond to the Letter of Notice by July 16, 2025.

13. On July 23, 2025, after Respondent failed to respond to the Letters of Notice, Petitioner filed a petition with the Disciplinary Hearing Commission ("DHC") setting forth the efforts made by the State Bar seeking Respondent's compliance and seeking entry of an order directing Respondent to show cause why his law license should not be suspended for noncompliance pursuant to 27 N.C. Admin. Code 1B.0135.

14. On July 23, 2025, the DHC entered an Order ("Order") directing Respondent to show cause within 14 days of the date of service of the Order why his law license should not be suspended for noncompliance.

15. Respondent was properly served with the Order, pursuant to 27 N.C. Admin. Code 1B.0135(d)(4), on July 23, 2025.

16. The Order warned Respondent that failure to respond to the Order may result in the suspension of his law license.

17. Respondent did not respond to the Order.

18. Respondent has not shown that he is in compliance, has not cured his noncompliance with the State Bar, and has not shown good cause for his noncompliance.

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact, the Chair makes the following:

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. All parties are properly before the Chair of the Disciplinary Hearing Commission, and the Disciplinary Hearing Commission has jurisdiction over Respondent, Andre N. Hogan, and over the subject matter of this proceeding.

2. Pursuant to 27 N.C. Admin. Code 1B.0135(e)(3), if the Respondent does not file a response to the order to show cause within 14 days of the date of the service of the order to show cause upon the Respondent, the Chair of the DHC may enter an order suspending the Respondent's law license.

3. The State Bar has established by clear, cogent, and convincing evidence that Respondent is noncompliant in grievance file numbers 24G0560, 25G0329, 25G0407, 25G0408, and 25G0597.

4. Respondent failed to establish that he was and is in compliance, that he fully cured all noncompliance, or that there is good cause for his noncompliance. None of these three circumstances have been established in this case.

5. Respondent is noncompliant in grievance file numbers 24G0560, 25G0329, 25G0407, 25G0408, and 25G0597 as defined in 27 N.C. Admin. Code 1B.0135(a).


6. Respondent's noncompliance is grounds for the suspension of his law license pursuant to 27 N.C. Admin. Code 1B.0135(e)(3) and (g).

Based upon the foregoing Findings of Fact, and Conclusions of Law, the Chair of the Disciplinary Hearing Commission enters the following:

ORDER

1. Respondent, Andre N. Hogan, is hereby suspended from the practice law.
2. This order shall be effective 30 days after it is served on Respondent by mailing a copy of the order by regular mail to the following address: P.O. Box 10033, Wilmington, NC 28404.
3. Respondent shall comply with all the wind-down provisions of 27 N.C. Admin. Code 1B.0128, as provided in 27 N.C. Admin. Code 1B.0135(h).
4. Any petition by Respondent to be reinstated to the practice of law shall be governed by 27 N.C. Admin. Code 1B.0135(i).
