Based upon the Affidavit of Surrender of Law License submitted to the court by Chadwick C. Lee, the court makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Chadwick C. Lee was licensed to practice law in North Carolina on August 24, 2001.
2. Lee operated a law office in Johnston County, North Carolina.
3. On this date, Lee entered pleas of guilty to ten (10) counts of felony obstruction of justice, ten (10) counts of altering an official case record, and one (1) count of conspiracy to commit felony obstruction of justice.
4. Lee is in fact guilty of the criminal offenses to which he pled guilty.

Based upon the foregoing Findings of Fact, the court makes the following:

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. By committing ten (10) counts of felony obstruction of justice, ten (10) counts of altering an official case record, and one (1) count of conspiracy to commit felony obstruction of justice, Lee violated Rules 8.4(b) and (c) of the North Carolina Rules of Professional Conduct.

2. Lee's misconduct constitutes grounds for discipline pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. Section 84-28(b)(2).

3. Lee's misconduct has caused significant actual harm to the legal profession and to the public's perception of the justice system.

4. The court finds that lesser alternatives, including public censure, reprimand, admonition or suspension of Lee's law license would not be sufficient discipline to protect the public from the actual and potential harm to the public, the administration of justice, and the legal profession caused by Lee's conduct.

5. The court has considered lesser sanctions and determined that only disbarment or suspension of Lee's law license would adequately protect the public from the actual and potential harm to the public, the administration of justice, and the legal profession caused by Lee's conduct.

- a. Lee's misconduct involves moral turpitude and violations of the public trust.

b. Lee's misconduct involves misrepresentations and deceit. Misconduct involving misrepresentations and deceit are among the most serious that an attorney can commit.

c. Lee's criminal offenses reflect adversely on his honesty, trustworthiness or fitness as a lawyer.

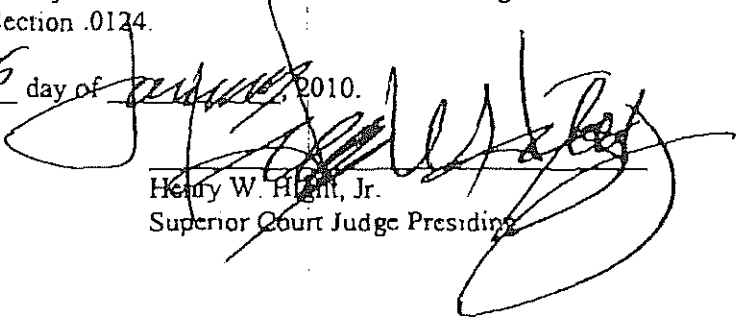
d. Entry of an order imposing less serious discipline would fail to acknowledge the seriousness of the offenses and would send the wrong message to attorneys and the public regarding the conduct expected of members of the Bar of this State.

e. Protection of the public and of the legal profession require that Lee not be permitted to resume the practice of law until he demonstrates the following: that he has reformed; that he understands his obligations to his clients, the public, and the legal profession; and that permitting him to practice law will not be detrimental to the public or the integrity and standing of the legal profession or the administration of justice. Disbarred lawyers are required to make such a showing before they may resume practicing law.

IT IS NOW, THEREFORE, ORDERED:

1. Chadwick C. Lee is DISBARRED from the practice of law in North Carolina.
2. This Order of Disbarment is effective immediately upon entry.
3. Chadwick C. Lee shall comply with the provisions of Subchapter B, Section .0124 of the Rules and Regulations of the North Carolina State Bar and shall surrender his license and permanent membership card to the Secretary of the North Carolina State Bar along with the affidavit required by Subchapter B, Section .0124.

1. I desire to resign and hereby tender my license to practice law in North Carolina.
2. My resignation is freely and voluntarily rendered. It is not the result of coercion or duress. I am fully aware of the implication of submitting my resignation.
3. I have today entered a plea of guilty to ten (10) counts of felony obstruction of justice, ten (10) counts of altering an official case record, and one (1) count of conspiracy to commit felony obstruction of justice. I am in fact guilty of these charges.
4. I know that if disciplinary charges were predicated upon these criminal offenses, I could not successfully defend against them.
5. I consent to be disbarred from the practice of law in North Carolina.
